## MRA CUSTOMS INTERCEPTS DANGEROUS DRUGS AT AIRPORT



The Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA), in collaboration with ADSU, seized **300 Tramazac capsules** on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> May 2017 at the SSR International Airport. The capsules listed under the Dangerous Drug Act were found under the lining at the bottom of the luggage of female Mauritian passenger aged 35, who was travelling on the flight MK 749 from Mumbai.

The passenger was intercepted by the MRA Customs Anti-Narcotics Section (CANS) on the basis of profiling while she was leaving through the green channel at the airport and upon questioning, she stated that she may produce the prescription needed later on.

The capsules were secured by the MRA Customs Department and both the passenger and the capsules were handed over to the ADSU for inquiry.
