NOTICE TO AGENTS - SUBMISSION OF INWARD MANIFEST

- The master, owner or duly authorized agent of a ship or aircraft may submit <u>partial inward manifest</u> to the Director-General after loading in each port of departure.
- Economic operators may submit their Bill of Entry as soon as the partial inward manifest is submitted.
- Whenever the master, owner or duly authorized agent of a ship or aircraft is amending a manifest, he shall clearly mention in the request for amendment (addition/deletion) whether it pertains to partial inward manifest or final inward manifest.
- No fee is applicable for any request for amendment (addition/deletion) relating to partial inward manifest.
- As per Section 49 of Customs Act, the master, owner or duly authorized agent of a ship or aircraft shall submit inward manifest to the Director-General within the statutory period.
- For ships arriving
 - from Reunion Island and Republic of Madagascar, inward manifests should be submitted not later than 5 hours before arrival; or
 - from any other port, not later than 24 hours after loading in the last port of departure.



- For aircraft, where the flight duration
 - does not exceed 4 hours, at the time the wheels of the aircraft reach its body after take-off;
 - exceeds 4 hours, not later than 4 hours before arrival.
- Amendment fee will be applicable on a consignment basis on all requests for amendment submitted after the submission of the full and complete inward manifest.

Amendments to Section 49 of the Customs Act and Regulations 20A and 22 of the Customs Regulations 1989 have come into operation on 1 December 2016.
