30 Amphetamine tablets seized at a Courier Service



The Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA), in collaboration with the Anti-Drug & Smuggling Unit (ADSU), seized 30 Amphetamine tablets worth Rs 60,000 at a courier service on Saturday 13 July, 2024.

The consignment coming from London on 13 July 2024 on flight MK053 was initially tagged by MRA Customs Anti-Narcotics Section (CANS), based on established risk indicators. Suspicious images were revealed upon scanning and the consignment was further examined. It was found to contain one orange plastic container containing 30 pink tablets. A field test for amphetamine was performed on a sample of the tablet. The result was revealed to be positive. The exhibits were handed over to ADSU.

One person has been arrested following a controlled delivery exercise.
